"Oakland East Bay Symphony"

MICHAEL MORGAN

Music Director

Currently in his eighth season as Music Director of the Oakland East Bay Symphony, Michael Morgan was born in 1957 in Washington, DC. There he attended public schools and began conducting at the age of 12. While a student at the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music, he spent a summer at the Berkshire Music Center at Tanglewood. There he was a student of Gunther Schuller and Seiji Ozawa and it was during that summer that he first worked with Leonard Bernstein.

In 1980 he won lst prize in the Hans Swarowsky International Conductors Competition in Vienna, Austria and became Assistant Conductor of the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra, under Leonard Slatkin. His operatic debut was in 1982 at the Vienna State Opera in Mozart's The Abduction from the Seraglio.

In 1986 Sir Georg Solti chose him to become the Assistant Conductor of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in Chicago he was also conductor of the Civic Orchestra, the training orchestra of the Chicago Symphony, and the Chicago Youth Symphony Orchestra.

In 1986 he was also invited by Leonard Bernstein to make his debut with the New York Philharmonic and has conducted that orchestra several times since. Other guest appearances have included the Berlin State Opera, St. Louis Opera Theatre, Washington Opera and New York City Opera. He has conducted the San Francisco, National, Baltimore, Houston, Seattle, Vancouver, Detroit and Oregon Symphony Orchestras; as well as the Los Angeles and Warsaw Philharmonics and the Philadelphia Orchestra. During the last year he conducted concerts in Paris and Israel, and in the next year will conduct the orchestras of Atlanta, Buffalo and Richmond, Virginia.

In addition to his duties at the Oakland East Bay Symphony, he is Artistic Director & Principal Conductor of the Oakland Youth Orchestra, and Music Director of the Festival Opera in Walnut Creek. He makes over 100 appearances in the nation's schools, particularly in the

East Bay, and gives many speeches on the importance of music education and minority access to, and participation in, the arts.

Cliff Dochterman served for 40 years in higher education administration at the University of the Pacific and the University of California before his retirement in 1990. Dr. Dochterman has been active in many national, civic and professional organizations. He is the recipient of the George Washington Honor Medal of the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge for his contributions to the American way of life. He has been awarded three of the highest honors of the Boy Scouts of American, the Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope and Distinguished Eagle awards. He has served as president of the Stockton Chamber of Commerce, the 49er Council of the Boy Scouts of America, chairman of the San Joaquin Parks and Recreation Commission and a member of the California State Council for the Humanities.

For 39 years, Cliff has been a member of Rotary International. His leadership culminated in 1992-93 when he was selected to be the world president. He has been honored and decorated by the heads of state of many nations for his contributions to goodwill and understanding in the world. Rotary International presented him with its Distinguished Service Award for his continuing humanitarian work throughout the world and his initial leadership in creating the PolioPlus program to immunize all children of the world against polio.

Cliff is currently chairman of the Trustees of the Rotary Foundation, which provides over \$58 million annually in scholarships, educational programs and humanitarian projects throughout the world.

think we got the money to buy the TV anyway??? JEFF N. was happy that the Richmond Art Center just completed the first phase of collaboration with the Armory Center for the Arts in Pasadena. BART WALLACE was happy to be back (it's good to have you back, BART).

LESLIE LEVY introduced Joanna Moss, Ph.D., as a "superwoman". And, judging from the introduction and the talk, I would agree that Dr. Moss is impressive. Dr. Joanna Moss is an economics professor at SF State University. Her talk was "Making Sense of the Asian Financial Crisis". The background for the crisis began in the 1970s with oil price increases. The countries involved are Thailand, South Korea, Malaysia, Indonesia and the Philippines.

These countries were the "Darlings" of international investors with hundreds of billions of US dollars pouring in. South East Asian investors borrowed US dollars at much lower interest rates than the currency in their own countries. South East Asian economics became tied to the dollar.

Last summer the big problems started in Thailand. Their currency was devalued by 17%. The same scene was repeated in the other countries. This meant that investors were not able to repay loans. The debt crisis was also a currency crisis. The International Monetary Fund (IMF)

came in to attempt to maintain order. The IMF is very controversial. They required borrowing countries to reform their banking and business practices. Dr. Moss explained the "Moral Hazard" of the IMF bail out -- critics felt that if countries were bailed out, they couldn't be accountable or responsible for reforming their banking and business practices.

The plan is to roll over and elongate the debt by providing funds to viable, non-corrupt and solvent businesses. They are being encouraged to finance through stocks and bonds rather than banks. The good news is that imports and foreign production will be cheap. This will be hard on domestic manufacturers, but Southeast Asian countries are actually very small trading partners, so the U.S. economy should not be greatly affected. I hope she's right.

Program:

TED ABREU introduced Devi Jameson, Director of the School-to-Career program for the West Contra Costa Unified School District. She explained that it is more than a "program". It is a whole system designed to help our students prepare to enter the modern workforce as part of the new global economy. There are over 100 community partners -- the board is chaired by Kaiser. The board helps steer the School-to-Career efforts. There are 5 comprehensive high schools and alternative sites. They have young people working with a high tech committee to bring technology into the schools. Participation of local business takes many forms from internships to job shadowing. The newest effort is having teachers intern in local corporations and then write curriculum based on their experience. Kids need adult role models, and the approach works well for that. She then showed a video tape that described the "microsociety" concept in which an entire school will function as a "society" as an alternative, or in addition to standard curriculum. It was very interesting to see kids functioning as bankers, in legal and justice jobs, as store clerks and more. It appears

to be a great way to get students interested in learning -everything is applicable to the "real" world. Statistics so far show that kids in the "micro-society" schools are getting better test scores and generally doing better academically. WCCUSD micro-society training starts in September.

renamed Bay Area Rescue Mission. Malcolm gave a brief synopsis of his early life and how he came to Richmond in 1969 and to his present position. There was some mention of "misspent youth", but no details were forthcoming.

The philosophy of the Mission, which primarily serves the homeless, is--"If you don't have a friend in the world, you can find one here." The Mission now has 275 beds and serves 20,000 meals a month. They have recovery programs which promote lifestyle changes literacy, job skills and recruitment to service in the inner city. Malcolm pointed out that, of the current staff of 48 at the mission, 16 were obtained through the recovery process.

The Mission's youth activities include tutoring, a computer lab and after school clubs for young kids, a Drop-In for junior and senior high students and sports programs in collaboration with the Police Activities League (PAL).

Malcolm's thoughts on the causes of homelessness were of particular interest. He feels that it is due to a crisis of moral principles, a crisis of family values and a crisis of compassion. There are also myths about homelessness: many believe that the homeless choose this lifestyle, and we fail to comprehend the lack of resources and support systems.



Happy Dollars:

Dr. DON MILLER was "trippin", DAVID BROWN had a lot to say (surprise, surprise...) on the nuances of pronouncing GSE team members' names, HANK COVELL offered his thoughts on scholarships, JON LAWLIS on Vday, MICHAEL BROWN on the costs prior to Graduation, MARK LACHMAN on the continued appearance of Rubicon in the news, me on the outstanding (and yes, I am bragging, Counselor...) scholastic achievements of the children who live with me; Chris, Angel and Gaby. DON HARDISON was just happy and JOE BAGLEY proffered a "Go Bulls" for some minor sports team or other (anything outside the Richmond PAL isn't worth getting worked up about...).

Program:

Our Speaker today was Lynn Mack, formerly of ECHS, SF State and now with the Rate Payer Advocate office of the California Public Utilities Commission. Mr. Mack began by reeling off one of the best Acronymal Extravaganzas I've ever heard, to the delight of everyone present. He then got down to the serious business of the choices facing us as users of electrical power. The recent voter mandate divided power generation from the transmission and distribution, creating a situation not unlike the break-in of the phone companies (now we're having fun...). His main caveat was to "choose wisely..." and pointed out (and I'll paraphrase) that these generation companies will subscribe heavily to the "If you can't dazzle 'em with brilliance, then baffle 'em with..." strategy.

Your new bill arrives "unbundled", that is to say, itemized into the various charges associated with the entire electrical transaction (Generation, Transmission, Distribution, etc.). These items were always there, just listed as "heh, turn off the lights, it costs money..." in one big bite. Now, we know more than we ever wanted to know about why it's so expensive. The only competition will be in the Generation of power (Nuclear, Steam, Coal, Wind, etc.), the rest will remain as always. The benefits, in Lynn's estimation, were nebulous; a huge "maybe". By the time people unconfuse themselves, it could be a very expensive education. But at any rate, he concluded it would take at least four years to get to a point to see any measurable benefits at the consumer level. His job is to ensure against fraud and deceptive business practices during the changeover. There is a Call Center for consumers, and he brought numerous handouts containing a wealth of information (yet another reason to attend Rotary...).

As expected, there were many questions, and Lynn took the time to answer them all. The watchword was that confusion will reign, don't be fooled; ask a lot of questions, and get answers.

Program:

"Viagra - The Real Thing?" with Dr. Maurice Sandler. JIM BEAVER did his best to introduce Dr. Sandler with a straight face and through the introduction the tendency toward humor was expected and delivered appropriately. I therefore deliver this report straight.

Dr. Sandler began by describing sexual and erectile dysfunction as now recognized as a bisexual disease - as sexual arousal problems occur with women as well as men. Most of the talk was about men's dysfunction, as not much research has been done yet about women's problems. About 50% of male population over 40 years of age have

admitted problems of some degree. This translates to over 25 million men. The interest in Viagra has actually helped save many men's lives because sexual dysfunction can be a symptom of a much more serious condition. Dr. Sandler presented a huge list of drugs and substances that can have an effect on sexual function. He then talked about drugs that can help problems such as premature ejaculation and erectile dysfunction. He pointed out that one of the leading causes of sexual dysfunction is depression and discussed medications that help sexual function and are antidepressants. He also talked about lifestyle change as a very important remedy.

He then went on to describe Viagra in medical terms. It only works in men who already have some degree of function and doesn't work if there is total dysfunction. He also warned that Viagra can be fatal if you're taking nitro or nitrate heart medication. He also warned that you must be aware of your physical ability before engaging in sexual activities. A minimum is that you should be able to briskly walk up two flights of stairs. He concluded by describing women's sexual function and dysfunction in medical terms as very similar to men's. There are now many studies being conducted so that women will be able to get the same type of treatment and attention as men. Good work Dr. Sandler, keep it up!







Program: Ken Stuart, Director of Environmental Health for Contra Costa County gave a very interesting presentation about health concerns. Ken is a member and former president of the Folsom Rotary Club. He talked briefly about the Folsom Club's big hot rod show with 500 rods. It is a great success and raises a lot of money each year.

He then spent the rest of the time scaring us about environmental health concerns that the Contra Costa Environmental Health Department works on. Using slides, he talked about water wells, restaurants, land development, sewage, etc. Their department handles permits and environmental hazards from septic tanks to food service. He mentioned that Richmond is the best city in the county to work with because there is a professional and cooperative attitude. He showed appetizing slides of local restaurants with cockroaches, piles of defrosting chicken, dirty prep areas, food vendors, fairs and carnivals and on and on. 





caused by trauma to the body, particularly the spine. However, misalignments and consequent pressure on nerves leading to bodily organs can result in a wide variety of ailments, including such seemingly unlikely problems as gastritis and bedwetting. Chiropactors stress health and nutrition and emphasize disease prevention. They do not prescribe drugs, nor do they do surgery.

Training for chiropractors includes two to four years in basic science and four years of Chiropractic College. The curriculum they follow is similar to that for medical doctors, except there is more emphasis on anatomy and nutrition and less on pharmaceuticals. A one year internship is also required.

LUCIA stated that Chiropractic is the most effective treatment for lower back conditions, and it is also cost effective. Asked if X-rays are always needed, she responded that they are not except in trauma situations. Like other doctors, she carries professional liability insurance.



"More Than Clay: The Toki Collection of Ceramics" **JOHN TOKI**

John Toki is an Adjunct Professor at the California College of Arts and Crafts, where he teaches in the ceramics, sculpture and core departments. He is the president and owner of Leslie Ceramic Supply Company in Berkeley (the largest ceramic supply company in Northern California). He is also a past president of the Richmond Art Center Board of Directors and currently serves as a trustee of the Art Center. He has been active over the years promoting ceramic arts for local schools and professional artists at the Toki Gallery.

The Toki family has been collecting ceramic art works for over three decades and now has one of the most extensive collections of Bay Area ceramics in the country. As the Bay Area is home to the country's most important community of ceramic artists, this collection is extremely valuable. The collection is currently on view at the Richmond Art Center through November 14, 1998.

Since 1974, Toki has maintained a sculpture studio in Richmond. He has completed public and private commissions in Europe and the U.S. including Sacramento, Harvard and Richmond. In 1994, he was chosen to produce a ceramic sculptural mural for Oakland City Hall He has conducted sculpture workshops and lectured in Canada, Alaska, Holland, and in 1997 for the Taiwan Ceramic Association, in Taipei, and Marmara University, Istanbul, Turkey in 1998.

In addition to his art practice, John Toki is the co-author of the ceramics textbooks, "Hands In Clay", fourth edition, and "Make It In Clay", Mayfield Publishing Company, Mountain View, California. The textbooks are used in over 2900 colleges throughout the United States and abroad.

sponsors youth programs. He described Rotary Foundation as "our bank". It pays for all of Rotary International's work, e.g., GSE scholarships, the Polio Project, Technical Assistance Teams and Matching Grants.

During the course of talk, DG Paul presented some interesting facts and figures:

- · The Rotary Scholarship program is four times larger that the Fullbright and Rhodes Scholarship programs combined.
- Rotary and the Salvation Army put out the highest percentage of money with the lowest overhead.
- · The Alaska District includes all of that state but also stretches as far as the Urals in Russia and includes thirty clubs in Siberia.
- The presidency of Rotary International rotates back to the United States every third year.
- · Regarding the Polio Irradication Project, on one National Immunization Day (NID) 133 million children were immunized in one twenty-four hour period.
- · There are no Rotary Clubs in China at present, but we are working on that. The problems that need to be overcome involve issues such as freedom of assembly, free mobility both within the country and across borders, and ability to move money across borders.

The District Governor's explanations were so clear that perhaps he can return another time and try to explain to us, once again, the intricacies of the various funds. However, that may be a task beyond human possibility or comprehension.

"Conservation in Costa Rica"

BERNARD NIETSCHMANN, Ph.D. Professor of Geography U.C. Berkeley

Dr. Bernard Nietschmann received his doctorate from the University of Wisconsin at Madison. He is considered world authority in the area of Conservation. He is on the Committee for Research and Exploration for the National Geographic Society and has conducted biodiversity conservation research for 30 years in Costa Rica. 

Club Secretary JOE NUSBAUM inducted TOM ARTZ of Chevron into the club. TOM was welcomed with the traditional standing ovation.


Recognitions, Happy/Sad \$\$\$, etc.:







Kaye Burnside presented an inspirational report on the progress of Washington School. She talked about the transformation of a failing institution to a very strong community based program in which we could all take pride. Ms. Burnside recalled that her education was filled with discipline, support, challenge and excitement. She felt that the students as Washington Elementary School deserved no less and set a personal goal to turn the operation around. She reminded us that Richmond can have excellent schools if we have a commitment to excellence. She said, "it's not about the land, it's about the people". She made it known to the teachers, the parents and the community that if they truly wanted to succeed, everyone would be expected to be into believing that the school could be exemplary. She described programs such as "Adopt-a-Classroom", Spirit of Excellence", partnerships with UC Berkeley for teacher training homework centers and "Fun Fridays" all organized so that the Washington School could offer a "private school education at public school prices." The efforts of the Many Hands Foundation, the school itself, as well as just about everyone tied to the school, has brought about international recognition as well as significant grant support. Earlier this year, Ms. Burnside received a \$15,000 award from the Many Hands Foundation to write a book on the Washington School success story to be used as primer for other schools that are committed to turning their programs around. Kaye Burnside's experience reminded all of us that it really does "take a village to raise a child".

Program:

Mayor Rosemary (McGowan) Corbin was introduced by TOM (no close relation to Rosemary) McGowan. Mayor Corbin presented a "good news--troublesome news" report about the condition of Richmond. Examples of the good news included a prestigious award from the Urban Land Institute for Memorial Parkside development in Richmond; construction of Transit Village which will enhance downtown Richmond through new housing, new shopping and an entertainment complex all built around Richmond's intermodal transportation station at BART and Amtrak; Renovation of the old Ford Plant; and development of upscale housing units at Ferry Point. 

Terminal 1 (former Petromark site in Brickyard Cove) which now is slated to receive new upscale housing, the Central Richmond Greenway, Point Molate and the old railroad right of way at Ohio Avenue which could become a bike path.

Kent pointed out that Richmond, along with other cities in the Bay Area, has acreage that could be targeted for redevelopment and/or rehabilitation that currently cannot be sold because of liabilities stemming from contamination. Cities have been slow to move on contamination cleanup because of regulatory involvement, large financial layouts for clean up as well as ongoing commitments to property maintenance. The Brownfield's project expedites the cleanup process through a program of assistance with site assessment, community education programs, technical review with developers and production of marketing materials. The impact of cooperation means faster turnaround time in pollution removal which will lead to broader economic development. It is truly a win-win story for the environment groups and the developers.

Brownfields is another demonstration of how Richmond is working hard to become a better place to live, work and recreate.

Speaker for the Day:





Program:

JIM SHATTOCK, playing the part of the proud father, introduced SHERYL LYNN SHATTOCK RENK, principal clarinetist of the San Francisco Ballet Orchestra. Sheryl is currently playing with SF Symphony while on a year leave of absence from the Ballet. During his introduction, Jim informed us that Sheryl always showed musical talent from an early age -- she could sing the Star Spangled Banner at age two! Sheryl decided she wanted to pay the clarinet when she was very young because it "looked like licorice".

Sheryl told us a lot about what it is like to play in an orchestra while playing excerpts from many different composers to illustrate the history and range of the instrument. She explained that most orchestras have 2-4 "staff" clarinetists and that free lance musicians are hired to fill in as needed. Many symphony orchestras in America have been in trouble in recent years and the San Diego Symphony, where she worked previously, was forced to declare bankruptcy. Most orchestras are nonprofit organizations and depend on grants, donations and fundraisers as well as ticket sales. She went on to describe cultural institutions such as symphonies, ballets, museums and the like as being at the heart of a city's cultural An important addition to this is the value music and art classes have in the schools. It has been proven that the arts help academic achievement in many substantial ways.

It was fascinating to hear Sheryl describe the construction, mechanics and history of the clarinet. It is a relatively new instrument to the orchestra and the first concerto for the instrument was written in the mid 1700s. She then went on to play wonderful exampes from many composers including Mozart, Brahams, Prokofiev and Gershwin. Her playing, like her verbal presentations, was sensitive, elegant and articulate.
